Who are We? Where Are We Going? and Where do We Come From?

The deceiver of nations has confused us with his theories of "scientific proof" which he has used to distance us from faith. He has lead us away from believing in what we do not see, which is the means of salvation established by God. Despite the fact that all of creation is before our eyes to verify our faith, the enemy has in one way or another blinded us and instead leads us to believe in his false laws and ordinances and sophisticated ways of living. He has made us like irrational animals not looking for the reason of life and not thinking or realizing that we have a final encounter with death.

Romans 3:23 KJV

[23] For all have sinned, and come short of the glory of God;

If we only understood *how*, *with what*, *when* and *where* we sin we would then understand *who we are* and *why we are here*.

If we have been deprived of the glory of God, then we must ask, "Where was the glory of God?" If we are able to answer this question then we will understand where we came from.

There are a myriad of questions about all aspects of life that are necessary to answer in order to have a better understanding, for example:

Have you ever wondered why we were born? Why we are born innocent, small, defenseless, and dependent on two people who look like us? (mother and father)

Why do these two people (mother and father) have to first make the decision to procreate us, either through love, attraction or desire?

Why do we have to be innocent and then decide between good and evil when we reach the peak of our lives?

Why, later in life, do we slowly once again become defenseless and dependent on our relatives (our children)?

And finally, why does the body we are born in die, as if it were a rag that is borrowed and then wears out? Why do we have a limited time on Earth and where will we go afterwards?

Science is bare with very few answers yet it tries to blindly lead us, but how can the blind lead the blind? In science you have to be able to touch in order to believe, just like blind people who have to touch to beleive. It has shown us to blindly accept and follow it through the road it travels, a road of "seeing is believing and touching is believing" but it doesn't tell us that ultimately all its paths lead to death. Science knows absolutely nothing about death, and that is where science ends.

We live in darkeness, even if we live under the light of day:

Isaiah 59:10 KJV

[10] We grope for the wall like the blind, and we grope as if we had no eyes: we stumble at noonday as in the night; we are in desolate places as dead men.

The main problem that we have is our own body, the desires of the flesh, which bind us and do not let us see beyond it. When the answer to everthing is not in the flesh but in the Spirit and to become spiritual there is only one book that wisely leads and guides us to find all the answers of life. It says:

John 1:14 KJV

[14] And the Word was made flesh, and dwelt among us, (and we beheld his glory, the glory as of the only begotten of the Father,) full of grace and truth.

Our Father is the creator of all people and all things. He personally came to Earth to declare the truth and power of his Word as stated in the Holy Bible which is the Holy and powerful living Word of our creator and the way in which He expressed the wonderful sound through which all things were created: "[I]et there be light, and there was light." It is the light that guides us to understand the Word, the one who enlightens our understanding. By simply finding the path of light we can be led to find the power of the Word and we would find God, and He tells us:

John 8:12 KJV

[12] Then spake Jesus again unto them, saying, **I am the light of the world**: he that followeth me shall not walk in darkness, but **shall have the light of life**.

And if He is the light of the world, then through Him we can easily find the path to get to understand the power of his Word.

John 1:1 KJV

[1] In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God.

"In the beginning was the Word" what this means is that God is the Word. If God is the Word, then before we read the Bible we must have a clear understanding

of what the word "Word" means? Then as you know word by word, verb by verb are then used to join words, to create actions and this in turn leads us to sentences, chapters, books and ultimately all of creation and Eternal Salvation.

The Holy Word of God is not only to read ir but also to understand it. (as it is written, let him who reads understand)

John 1:1 KJV

[1] In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God.

The way most of us read the Bible is very common. We read sentences, which are a set of words which tell us the meaning of the whole sentence, for example:

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God.

If we read it together, as we usually do, then we understand that in the beginning the Word was and the Word was with God and the Word was God. We still, however, are not understanding what is "the Word."

John 1:14 KJV

[14] And the Word was made flesh, and dwelt among us, (and we beheld his glory, the glory as of the only begotten of the Father,) full of grace and truth.

John 8:32 KJV

[32] And ye shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free.

And maybe you have never asked yourself:

Is the world a prison in general?
Is our flesh a personal prison to each one of us?
Is time the prison guard that keeps us in this prison?

IOh! but I wait for the train of death and eventually it will take me!

This is the cruel reality that we are all destined to have an encounter with death and yet no one knows what death is, where it comes from or where it goes. No living person knows.

What is death that takes life away from the body, and where does it take it?

This uncertainty should keep us on alert and preparing ourselves for that final day when we leave the land of the living. But what happens instead? Entertainment overwhelms us and it is stronger than the harsh reality that is looming. The daily matters of life entertain us and the reality of our lives takes up our time. Alive, we live trapped under the eyes of our enemy, who distracts us

with an array of entertainment so that our eyes do not see or focus on the light of the truth.

Matthew 6:22 KJV

[22] The light of the body is the eye: if therefore thine eye be single, thy whole body shall be full of light.

If we only had the strenght to focus on the path of light, which can be done through the Word of truth, we would shine, as the light of the universe.

Romans 8:29-30 KJV

[29] For whom he <u>did foreknow</u>, he also did <u>predestinate</u> to be conformed to <u>the image</u> <u>of his Son</u>, that he might be the firstborn among many brethren.

[30] Moreover whom he did predestinate, them he also called: and whom he called, them he also justified: and whom he justified, them he also glorified.

Our journey in this life began from the moment we were deprived of the glory of God. It is important that we realize that indeed we are the ones that He knew beforehand. This is where we find the answer to our question *where we came from*, "We came from being before the glory of God."

Our flesh is then according to the image of His Son, the firstborn among many brethren. With this we also know **who we are**: We are children of God.

What a wonder to know this. It is through this knowledge that we also know *where we are going*:

Morever whom He did predestinate, them He also called: and whom He called, them He also justified; and whom He justified, them He also glorified. (Romans 8:30)

Therefore our search and journey in this life has boiled down to finding if: We are part of those *predestined*If we were also *called*If we were also *justified*

If we answer these questions in the affirmative:

Then we will know where we will go after we die. Hallelujiah, we will be glorified. We will go to the glory of God where we originally came from.

It all sounds wonderful and is posible for anyone who "Seek the LORD while he may be found; call on him while he is near."

Isaiah 55:6-7 KJVS

[6] Seek ye the Lord while he may be found, call ye upon him while he is near: [7] Let the wicked forsake his way, and the unrighteous man his thoughts: and let him return unto the Lord, and he will have mercy upon him; and to our God, for he will abundantly pardon.

We have to live out the rest of our sentence/judgment (on account of our original sin) in the prison of this world whose cell is our flesh. While we live like this we will be exposed to the temptations of the enemy who is continually provoking our fleshly lusts through our eyes and through the spectrum of entertainment. Enterntainment and temptations that have been instilled in us as customs, traditions, necessities and that in one way or another drag us to the road of darkness even in the plain light of day. Our enemy knows what we like and what attracts us. We should instead focus our eyes on the Spirit so that we are not led astray.

This resolve, to focus on the right things, should be our priority. Our Lord Jesus Christ himself said:

Mark 9:47 (KJV)

And if thine eye offend thee, pluck it out: it is better for thee to enter into the kingdom of God with one eye, than having two eyes to be cast into hell fire:

This is the last opportunity (to return to what we were,) that God our Father will give us. We were children of light that now are dwindling/lost in our own darkness. We should thus focus on the path that takes us to the Truth and Life, which is Yeshua (Jesus).

John 14:6 (KJV)

Jesus saith unto him, I am the way, the truth, and the life: no man cometh unto the Father, but by me.

Knowing this let us walk with Him, because otherwise:

Hebrews 2:3 (KJV)

How shall we escape, if we neglect so great salvation; which at the first began to be spoken by the Lord, and was confirmed unto us by them that heard him;

Therefore while there is still time, let us take advantage of the opportunity of the goodness of His grace. Let us live the rest of our sentence in accordance with the Spirit, while we live in the jailcell, which is our flesh.

Romans 8:13-14 KJVS

[13] For if ye live after the flesh, ye shall die: but if ye through the Spirit do mortify the deeds of the body, ye shall live.

[14] For as many as are led by the Spirit of God, they are the sons of God.

Therefore our decisions in what we have left of life, should be based on the Spirit. Even if we live in the flesh, little by little, we are liberating ourselves from it while we are recognizing the truth. As the Word says, we have to be born again. This is precisely what happens when we turn our back to the ways of the world and evil, and we begin to walk in the way of the Spirit.

John 3:6-7 KJVS

- [6] That which is born of the flesh is flesh; and that which is born of the Spirit is spirit.
- [7] Marvel not that I said unto thee, Ye must be born again.

It is precisely the Word of Truth that is our nourishment because the Spirit needs light and the power of the Word in order to communicate with our Spirit.

Therefore it is written:

Matthew 4:4 (KJV)

But he answered and said, It is written, Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that proceedeth out of the mouth of God.

This is precisely through the power of the Word that:

Romans 8:16-17 (KJV) The Spirit itself beareth witness with our spirit, that we are the children of God: And if children, then heirs; heirs of God, and joint-heirs with Christ; if so be that we suffer with him, that we may be also glorified together.

Once we understand the Word through the Spirit, then we will be eternally grateful with God. We will finally understand the great sacrifice that our Lord Jesus made for us:

Isaiah 53:5 (KJV)

But he was wounded for our transgressions, he was bruised for our iniquities: the chastisement of our peace was upon him; and with his stripes we are healed.

He died on the cross to liberate us from the guilt of the flesh that enslaved us. He liberated our Spirit nailing on the cross the flesh once and for all, and so:

Colossians 2:14 (KJV)

[14] **Blotting out the handwriting of ordinances that was against us**, which was contrary to us, and took it out of the way, nailing it to his cross;

He did this for all the living and we only have to accept that He paid for all of our rebellion once and for all time:

Hebrews 10:12-13 KJVS

- [12] But this man, after he had offered one sacrifice for sins for ever, sat down on the right hand of God;
- [13] From henceforth expecting till his enemies be made his footstool.

Where he anxiously waits for you to chose the path to light and eternal life, which He clearly showed us when He lived among us.

Philippians 2:5-11 KJVS

- [5] Let this mind be in you, which was also in Christ Jesus:
- [6] Who, being in the form of God, thought it not robbery to be equal with God:
- [7] But made himself of no reputation, and took upon him the form of a servant, and was made in the likeness of men:
- [8] And being found in fashion as a man, he humbled himself, and became obedient unto death, even the death of the cross.
- [9] Wherefore God also hath highly exalted him, and given him a name which is above every name:
- [10] That at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, of things in heaven, and things in earth, and things under the earth;
- [11] And that every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

I also hope that you will confess Jesus Christ as your Lord and as you do it this will be a great joy in the family of God Almighty and so you can live forever and confidently say:

Galatians 2:20 (KJV)

I am crucified with Christ: nevertheless I live; yet not I, but Christ liveth in me: and the life which I now live in the flesh I live by the faith of the Son of God, who loved me, and gave himself for me.

Amen, may it so be:

Luke 15:7 (KJV)

I say unto you, that likewise joy shall be in heaven over one sinner that repenteth, more than over ninety and nine just persons, which need no repentance.

Luke 15:10 (KJV)

Likewise, I say unto you, there is joy in the presence of the angels of God over one sinner that repenteth.

Dear friend, it is truly an honor to serve our God by declaring the truth through the light He has given to my understanding. To Him be glory, Honor, power and praise, for ever and ever, through eternity. Amen.

If I do not have the pleasure of knowing you in person on earth, then we shall see each other in the clouds when Christ receives us in his glory. And since we will reign together with Him here on earth for a thousand years, then we will have one thousand years to get to know each other, Amen.
